

Total Revenue: \$184,000




Total Expense (Including Grants): \$30,000

TOGETHER WITH OUR GRANTEES AND PARTNERS...

2012 was a year of solid momentum with growing participation and involvement in every way. The first annual Woodard & Curran golf tournament, held in Hightstown, NJ, turned a profit of nearly \$5,000. The second annual Easy as Pi road races in Portland and Providence were also a success, raising approximately \$9,000 for the Foundation. The annual Woodard & Curran employee fundraising campaign far surpassed its goals, with pledges exceeding \$52,000.

WE TURN GREAT IDEAS...

Through the combined efforts of Woodard & Curran employees, corporate sponsors, and private support, the Foundation awarded two grants furthering our vision to empower local and global solutions for a healthier world. AguaClara Cornell in Ithaca, NY, and Mill City Grows of Lowell, MA, were the recipients

of the Foundation's 2012 grant awards

INTO MEANINGFUL IMPACTS...

Increased focus on spreading the good word of the Foundation led to a 32% increase in donations between 2011 and 2012 and allowed the Foundation to award two grants and to make a donation to Hurricane Sandy Relief efforts.

TO IMPLEMENT LOCAL AND GLOBAL SOLUTIONS...

AguaClara Cornell, recipient of a \$5,000 grant, is a group of students and faculty who research, invent, and design electricity-free, municipal-scale, water treatment plants to bring clean drinking water to rural, resource-poor communities in Honduras. The Foundation's grant has helped to provide funding for the organization's lab research.

After seeing a plant in operation, one AguaClara student stated, "I can now see how our research is actively affecting peoples' lives in real communities."

FOR A HEALTHIER WORLD...

Mill City Grows, an organization that creates opportunities for low-income residents to grow fresh fruits and vegetables at urban neighborhood gardens, received a \$2,500 grant. Mill City Grows' mission is to improve physical health, economic independence and environmental sustainability locally in Lowell, Massachusetts. The Foundation grant will allow Mill City Grows to add a garden coordinator position to develop three new urban gardens.
